ACCIDENTS AND INCIDENTS

TAS policies and procedures Starting with 1st of April 2022 we have transitioned all of our Accidents and Incidents records on our Online Platform Famly.

Please see below the procedures, and will kindly ask that if you are notified of an accident or incident via Famly that you acknowledge it via the platform.

We are also keeping an Accident/Incident Book which is safely kept and is accessible to all staff members and volunteers who use it when required. Any accident, however minor is entered into Famly and Accident Book by the member of staff witnessing the accident. It is then that member of staff's responsibility to ensure that either the parent, or the carer is informed and the Accident/Incident is acknowledged by the parent (or carer) on the day that the accident occurred.

An action plan sheet is completed after each form / page and the Accident/Incidents are reviewed monthly to identify any potential or actual hazards.

When there is any injury requiring GP or hospital treatment to a child, parent, staff member, volunteer or visitor, or in the unlikely death of a child or an adult on the premises, we make a report to the Health and Safety Executive using the RIDDOR format. Ofsted is also informed in these circumstances.

Procedures in the event of an accident/incident

Great care should be taken at all times to prevent injury to children and staff. However, accidents will happen and the way they are dealt with is extremely important.

•Tots and Scholars Nursery and Pre-School will always have at least a staff member on duty who will have Ofsted approved current First-Aid certificate covering babies and Young children. Following the latest requirement, all Tots and Scholars staff are First Aid Trained.

•Nursery will ensure that the first –aid equipment is kept clean, replenished and replaced as necessary. Sterile items will be kept sealed in their packages until needed.

•Safety gloves must be worn when dealing with any cuts, saliva or other body fluids: and then disposed of in the appropriate manner.

•The wound will be cleaned with sterile cloths or a cold compress applied. No ointment will be applied.

•If hospital attention is needed then the nursery manager, deputy manager or room leaders will make that decision and will take the necessary action to get that person to hospital.

•Staff must be aware of procedures for telephoning for an ambulance. Every effort must be made to contact the parents /carers.

Emergency Treatment

Prior parental consent for emergency/ medical treatment is asked for on the registration form completed by parents when the child joins the nursery. We meet our legal requirements for the safety of our employees by complying with RIDDOR.

ACTIVITIES FOR HOME

Scavenger hunt

As the weather is getting warmer and we are getting ready for the Nature Trail, to extend children's learning at home, for this month's activity, we are suggesting a Scavenger Hunt. The little ones will love an open-ended scavenger hunt (find something thin, something brown, something brittle, something rough, something round, something oval, something small, something hard, something big). We will first suggest you sit down with them and make a list of things they think could find in nature and you add the above suggestions, too. The clues will teach about colours, textures, and also scientific concepts can for the older children—for example, they need to search for something translucent that "lets the light shine through a bit."

DISH OF THE MONTH

Potato and Chickpea curry -

- 1. In a large pan or casserole pot gently cook the onion for 5 minutes in the sunflower oil.
- 2. Next add the garlic, ginger, garam masala and curry paste, continue cooking for 3 minutes over a medium heat.
- 3. Add the potatoes and chickpeas and give them a stir in the lovely spices making sure everything is coated. Pour in the tomatoes and coconut milk and bring to a steady simmer.
- 4 Season and continue to cook for 10-15 minutes, or until the potatoes are soft. If the sauce feels a little dry just add a little water.
- 5. Just before serving stir in the spinach and coriander then serve with the yogurt. (optional)
