FIRST AID & MEDICATION

TAS policies and procedures In our setting staff are able to take action to apply first aid treatment in the event of an accident involving a child or adult. All staff at Tots and Scholars are trained. The first aid qualification includes first aid training for infants and young children. We aim to ensure that first aid training is local authority approved and is relevant to staff caring for young children.

AIMS:

To identify the first aid needs of the setting

To ensure that first aid provision is available at all times when people are on premises, and also off the premises whilst on School trips

To appoint the appropriate number of suitably trained people as First Aiders and Appointed Persons to meet the needs of the School and to maintain current qualifications for those people

- To ensure that within the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) at least one person with a current paediatric first aid certificate is on the premises at all times when children are present and accompanies children on outings. The course content will cover that required for St John Ambulance or Red Cross paediatric first aid training, and be renewed every three years.
- To provide relevant training and ensure monitoring of training needs

To provide sufficient and appropriate resources and facilities

To inform staff and parents of the Setting's first aid arrangements

To keep accident records and to report to the HSE as required under the Reporting of Injuries, Diseases and Dangerous Occurrences Regulations 2013 (RIDDOR)

Our accident forms and file: Are kept safely and accessibly in the Filing Cabinet; All staff and volunteers know where it is kept and how to complete it; and Is reviewed at least half termly to identify any potential or actual hazards.

Ofsted is notified of any injury requiring treatment by a hospital doctor, or the death of a child or adult. When there is any injury requiring general practitioner or hospital treatment to a child, parent, volunteer or visitor or where there is a death of a child or adult on the premises, we make a report to the Health and Safety Executive using the format for the Reporting of Injuries, Diseases and Dangerous Occurrences.
