Safeguarding at TAS

One of the ways in which we make sure your child is safe is by implementing our responsibility to take all necessary steps to ensure the safety and welfare of all the children in our care in line with the procedures laid out by our local Safeguarding Partnership ("LSP"). Reminders for parents

- Please ensure you are sending sufficient nappies and wipes for your child.
- Can we kindly remind you that if a child gets sick during nursery hours please make arrangements to collect them as soon as possible.
- Please make sure your child has spare labelled clothes at all times.
 - Labelling All children's spare clothing and school uniform MUST be labelled, to avoid confusion in the cloakroom.

SETTLING-IN POLICY

Our procedure is as follows:

- Before a child starts to attend the setting, we use a variety of ways to provide his/her parents with information. These include written information including our prospectus and policies, displays about our planning of activities, the routine of the room and any other relevant information.
 - We allocate a key person to each child and his/her family before she/he starts to attend; the key person welcomes and looks after the child and his/her parents at the child's first session and during the settling-in process.
- We complete a Parent and Child Induction checklist, ensuring we collect all useful information regarding the child to enable us to support him/her during their settling in period and thereafter.
- At registration, we explain the process of settling-in with Parents and jointly decide on the best way
 to help the child to settle into the setting.
- We have an expectation that the Parent, Carer or close relative, will stay for most of the session during the first week, gradually taking time away from their child, increasing this as and when the child is able to cope.
- Younger children will take longer to settle in, as will children who have not previously spent time away from home. Children who have had a period of absence may also need their parent to be on hand to re-settle them.
- We judge a child to be settled when they have formed a relationship with their key person; for example the child looks for the key person when he/she arrives, goes to her/him for comfort, and seems pleased to be with her/him. The child is also familiar with where things are and is pleased to see other children and participate in activities.
- When parents leave, we ask them to say goodbye to their child and explain that they will be coming back, and when.
- We recognise that some children will settle more readily than others. The Nursery will be flexible in terms of children's individual needs. However some children who appear to settle rapidly are not ready to be left, so we expect that the parent will honour the commitment to stay for at least the first week if needed.
- We do not believe that leaving a child to cry will help them to settle any quicker. We believe that a child's distress will prevent them from learning and gaining the best from the Setting.
- We reserve the right not to accept a child into the setting without a parent or carer if the child finds it distressing to be left. This is especially the case with very young children.
- Staff will be forthcoming with feedback about children's days at Nursery and be available to answer
 any questions that might arise within initial period and thereafter
